Regulatory efforts in the states have potential to create new market opportunities for efficiency.







Maryland: A Case Study in Program Design






Beyond the Mandate: Market Driven EE Structures

Key components of building a market-based EE program:

- Needs a clear market driver in terms of policy to animate the marketplace for savings
- Explicit market price for efficiency savings
 - Price signal will depend on resource valuation that includes societal, system-wide, and locational benefits
 - Load Management Purchase Agreements
 - Price per avoided kWh
- Performance should be measured through verified savings rather than pre-determined value of inputs
