Electricity Use in Sector

- National: 37000 million kWh
 3.2% of Industrial Electricity Use
- Large variance at state level:
 - Colorado 10% of state industrial electricity use
 - New York 1.55% of state industrial electricity use



Opportunities for Electric Efficiency

- Irrigation:
 - Pumps
 - Water Measurement
- Lighting
- Ventilation Fans
- Other Motors

- Program Types: MT, rebate, education, R&D



Sector Specific Challenges

- Lack of Priority of Electricity Saving
- Lack of Delivery Infrastructure
- Many small energy consumers
