#### **Efficiency Partnerships in Northeast US**

- Programs and Partners:
  - Energy Star Products CT, RI, MA, NH, NY
  - Premium Motors CT, RI, MA, NH, NJ, NY, VT
  - State Efficiency Standards MD, CT, MA, NH, RI, NH, ME, NJ, NY
  - Value to programs: Leveraging, market effects
- Lesson Learned: Importance of policy support for MT and regional coordination
- Prognosis: OK but state budget issues are a challenge

# **Energy Efficiency Programs in the Southwest (AZ, CO, NM, NV, UT, WY)**

- 2003 Utility Program Funding ~ \$50 million
  - PacifiCorp (UT) \$20-25M
  - Nevada Power (NV) \$11M
  - Xcel Energy (CO) \$11M
  - Other ~\$5-10M
- Program funding on the rise -- could reach \$100 million by 2005
- Key drivers: high growth, IRP, water scarcity, air quality

### **Efficiency Partnerships in the Southwest**

- Very effective Energy Star Home programs in AZ and NV -- state/federal/utility/builders
- No regional partnerships related to energy efficiency so far
- Regional Market Transformation Initiative -- workshop in 2004, possible launch by 2005
- Opportunities: windows, evaporative cooling, reflective roofing, other innovative technologies and practices
