



Christopher Ziemann is the Transportation Planning Division Chief for Alexandria, VA, responsible for the City's Long Range Planning, Transit Planning, Pedestrian and Bicycle Program, and coordinating on development review and neighborhood plans, promoting sustainability as the City urbanizes quickly. Christopher is overseeing the update to the City's Transportation Master Plan, which will create a policy framework for AVs, CVs, and Smart Mobility that helps Alexandria maintain and improve its quality of life. Other major programs Chris' division is implementing include two new Bus Rapid Transit corridors, Vision Zero, and bikeshare and dockless devices. Previously, Chris was a Robert Bosch Foundation Fellow working with transit agencies in Hamburg, Germany. He served as the Chicago Bus Rapid Transit Project manager, and as a Transportation Planner at DDOT in Washington, DC. He has a Masters in Urban Planning from the University of North Carolina and a degree in International Relations from the University of Wisconsin.
