- Covers all modes: aviation, rail, highways, transit, water, and active transportation
















In order to maintain IIJA funding levels after 2026...

- A five-year bill will need \$143 billion in additional HTF revenue to continue current levels.
- To continue advance General Fund appropriations programs in IIJA, another \$195 billion will be needed.

...or a total of \$338 billion on top of existing HTF receipts.

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AASHTO Core Policy Principles for Reauthorization


- Ensure timely reauthorization of a long-term federal surface transportation bill
- Enact a long-term, sustainable revenue solution for the Highway Trust Fund
- Increase and prioritize formula-based federal funding provided to states
- Increase flexibility, reduce program burdens, and improve project delivery
- Support and ensure state DOT's ability to harness innovation and technology



Surface Reauthorization: Timeline

- February 2024: Formally kick off the IIJA reauthorization effort at the TPF meeting; 2024 AASHTO Washington Briefing; Washington, DC
- February 2024 to October 2024: Committees to develop and approve their policy recommendations white paper
- October 2024: TPF to review committee white papers; 2024 AASHTO Annual Meeting, Philadelphia, PA
- October 2024 to March 2025: Modal Councils and Special Committee on Freight to develop and approve their policy recommendations white paper
- March 2025: TPF to review Modal and Special Committee white papers; 2025 AASHTO Washington Briefing; Washington, DC
- March 2025 to May 2025: TPF to develop and review draft policy resolutions
- May 2025: TPF to deliberate on draft policy resolutions developed to date; 2025 AASHTO Spring Meeting
- August 2025: TPF to hold a special session to finalize and adopt draft policy resolutions for Board consideration, amend white papers as necessary, and develop legislative outreach strategy; Location TBD
- October 2025: AASHTO Board of Directors to consider and formally adopt policy resolutions, and amend white papers as necessary; 2025 AASHTO Annual Meeting
- October 2025 to September 2026: AASHTO members and staff to communicate and explain AASHTO's formal
 policy positions
- September 2026: IIJA expires on September 30, 2026
